Translators without Borders provides people access to vital knowledge in their language through translation, training of translators, best use of technology, and building translation capacity in underserved languages.

**Contract length: 4/6 months** 

Hours: Full time, flexible working hours

**Location: Athens** 

Travel: Occasionally in Greece

Due to the urgency of the vacancy, screening and interviews will commence immediately and the candidate can be selected at any stage before the closing date.

Translators without Borders, a US 501(c) 3 non-profit with an operations center in Kenya, was founded in 1993 to provide volunteer translations to non-profit organizations. In 2010, the organization started a virtual platform to better coordinate these resources. In the last five years, we have translated over 40 million words of life-saving and life-changing content in over 190 language pairs. Our activations around the Ebola crisis, the earthquake in Nepal, and the European refugee crisis have won widespread praise from the international community.

#### **Background**

TWB started responding to the European Refugee Crisis in October 2015 and has run two consecutive projects as a member of the Start network since that time. To date we have provided translations to partners working in the response, trained partner staff, professional and aspiring translators and interpreters, set up the translators and interpreters working group and established a humanitarian

interpreter roster. In October 2016 TWB started a new project under a Dfid funded consortium for information gathering and dissemination. The project will run until mid-September 2017.

#### The Role

The ERR Intern will work closely with ERR Project Manager and the wider ERR project team. He/She will be responsible for increasing the visibility of TWB's work in Greece through communication and advocacy activities, as well as project management and logistics support.

## Responsibilities

- Implement designated activities from the ERR communications plan in Greece at the external and internal levels; liaising as needed with the overall TWB communications team on original content creations, key messaging, campaigns etc
- Design awareness and information products, and all needed communications tools, or liaise with designers for their production.
- Support TWB communications, including writing blogs, articles, stories, interviews etc. And sharing these with the TWB communications team for possible wider use
- Create photos and videos, autonomously or with service providers and create and maintain an image database
- Occasional representation of TWB at meetings in Greece.
- Support in advocacy campaigns and/or events
- Support in organizing TWB team coordination visits to Greece.
- Suggest and organize events to promote TWB activities
- Support the logistics of the ground activities: organization of trainings, national working group, field visits, roster etc

## **Qualifications**

The ERR Intern should be enthusiastic about the importance of increasing access to knowledge through language, agree with the TWB mission and values in order to promote the organization. The right candidate is an energetic team player who agrees with TWB's basic beliefs and values and who can work virtually with team members based throughout the world. He or she can easily multitask, take initiative and suggest ideas out-of-the-box. Other desirable qualities are:

- Able to innovate to find creative solutions; willing to explore new technologies
- Resourceful, creative, multi-tasker
- Have previous experience in communications (internships and volunteering are considered valid experiences)
- Previous experience with non-profit organizations, particularly in development and/or disaster relief, is a plus

• Strong writing skills in both Greek and English.

## **Requirements**

- Excellent working knowledge of English and Greek.
- Previous communications experience (internships, volunteering, personal project...)
- Demonstrated writing experience
- Knowledge of Indesign, Illustrator, Photoshop are a plus
- Ability to create photos and videos autonomously are a plus
