



Over 700 languages are spoken in Indonesia.

Javanese is the most widely spoken language in the affected area of Sumatra, and Javanese and Sundanese in the affected part of Java.

Other languages spoken in the area include Lampung Api in Lampung, and Badui in Pandeglang.

At least one third of adults are not literate enough to locate information in written text, making visual and verbal communication especially important.

Outside urban areas, such as Serang, less than half the population have access to mobile phones.

It is essential that affected communities have access to information in a language and format that they can understand.
